West Bend — Brad Rindfleisch, a 2014 graduate of West Bend West High School, is the new baseball coach for his alma mater.

Rindfleisch currently teaches lessons and classes at Milwaukee Baseball Academy in Menomonee Falls. He continues to play for the Sheboygan A's State League amateur team and was named a State League Most Valuable Pitcher Award. His coaching career actually started at West Bend West immediately after graduating from high school as he was a bench coach for one year and then coached the junior varsity team for three years.

While a member of the West Bend West baseball team in high school, Rindfleisch helped the team to numerous conference championships and two second-place finishes at the state championships. He attended the University of Wisconsin-Stout where he was a closer on the baseball team.
