New Partnership Allows for More Nature-Based Programming at Preschool Level

WEST BEND — The West Bend School District is partnering with the Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Southeast to use its 275-acre Camp Silver Brook in West Bend for a new nature-based preschool program.

Beginning in fall 2024, the West Bend School District and its partner the Kettle Moraine YMCA will use Camp Silver Brook two days a week for the students enrolled in the 4K program at Trinity Lutheran Church. The other two days of instruction will remain at Trinity Lutheran. This transformation is designed to provide a richer learning experience for our students within the natural world.

The West Bend School District's 4K program already partners with the YMCA and Riveredge Nature Center to offer a nature-based 4K program located at Riveredge and Holy Trinity Church in Newburg.

"This newest feature of our Early Learning Program brings together the West Bend Schools, Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Southeast, and the Kettle Moraine YMCA for the benefit of our youngest learners," explains Jen Wimmer, superintendent of the West Bend School District. "Incorporating nature into the learning environment can have profound and lasting effects on a child's development, providing a well-rounded educational experience," said Wimmer.

"Children who participate in Girl Scouts' outdoors programs – whether it's nature activities like the YMCA's 4K or during summer camp – are exposed to challenging experiences that help them develop leadership skills and outdoor stewardship at all ages," said Ana Simpson, CEO of Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Southeast. "We are excited to bring this outdoor education to students in the West Bend School District as we continue to provide access to these growth opportunities for the next generation."

This shift aligns with research indicating that nature-based education not only enhances academic performance, but also contributes to the overall well-being and development of children, possibly resulting in enhanced academic performance, increased physical activity, and improved social skills.

"Outdoor learning environments can stimulate a child's curiosity and interest in subjects like science, math, and language arts. We are pleased to be a partner in this collaboration because we have seen how nature provides an endless source of inspiration and stimulates creativity and imagination," said Rob Johnson, CEO of the Kettle Moraine YMCA.
