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Violins of Hope Exhibit and Concert at West Bend East and West High Schools

WEST BEND – The West Bend School District is the only school district in the state to host an exhibit of instruments from the Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra's Violins of Hope—a powerful collection of string instruments once owned and played by Jewish musicians before and during the Holocaust.

Violins of Hope is a project that restores string instruments, each one with a story. These instruments were played by Jewish musicians during the Holocaust in concentration camps, in hiding, and in the ghettos. After being recovered and painstakingly restored, they now signify resilience and hope. They are used for exhibitions, concerts, and educational programs as a commemoration of the lives lost and honors the resilience of the human spirit.

On Thursday, January 8, 2026, the community is invited to a free exhibit of some of the instruments. In addition, West Bend High Schools art students will display art and the band, orchestra, and choirs will perform a concert of remembrance.

Concert: 7:30 p.m. in the West Bend High Schools auditorium. (Enter on the East side of the building for both events.)
